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
Major Challenges:

Institutional Setting

- Philippine Constitution



MEGA CEBU APPROACH: BASICS OF ENGAGEMENT








MCDCB: Coordination Mechanism

Outcome:10 AREAS OF COOPERATION

- 1) Integrated development, urban and land use planning and zoning
- 2) Transport and traffic management
- 3) Pollution control and solid waste disposal & management
- 4) Flood control, drainage and sewerage system
- 5) Public safety and security
- 6) Road improvement and infrastructure development
- 7) Urban renewal and shelter
- 8) Coastal resources and watershed management
- 9) Climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction 10) Health & sanitation and environmental management







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Lessons learned:

- Tripartite Governance System can work
