Main findings: Awareness

- Increasing awareness of the SDGs: Out of 33 respondents, 82% are aware of and make reference to SDGs, compared to 31% in 2019
- •**Reference** in local and/or regional development strategies: 30%
- •Activities with external partner organisations to foster sense of partnership and cooperation: 30%
- •Political statements, as very important trigger for action on the SDGs
- •Alignment of local development plans with SDGs (with support from national associations) : 23 respondents



Main findings: Governance

- Official national strategy: over 79%, compared to 69% last year
- •Recognition of need to **support local and regional action**: 58% (of above)
- •Coordination mechanisms vary from country to country, and depend strongly on the relationship with national governments (opportunity to improve advocacy with national governmens)
- •Participation and engagement in **national HLPF reports**: 58% in 2019 and 54% in 2020 (depends on reporting countries)
 - •9 European countries reporting in 2020, 5 for the first time: Austria, Bulgaria (not in the survey), Moldova, North of Macedonia and Ukraine (working with the 2030 Agenda is still a young concept)



Main findings: Decentralised Cooperation

- •Reach out to peers beyond European borders and to develop or enhance international partnerships: 16 associations
- •Entry point for local and regional governments to connect, by working together towards common objectives
- •Reflection on the impact of own policies on partner countries
- •Strengthening of advocacy activities that enhance the **role of LRGs in international and national institutions**: 15 respondents
- •Strengthening of partnerships and collaboration (18 associations) and development of new partnerships (16 associations)



Main findings: Decentralised Cooperation

•Work on **all SDGS** with international peers (39%) or **focused cooperation** around certain goals (19%)

- •gender equality (SDG 5)
- •inequalities (SDG 10)
- •sustainable cities and communities (SDG 11)
- •climate action (SDG 13)
- •peace, justice and strong institutions (SDG 16)

•Training and capacity building (15 associations) as core activities to support international peers

- •study visits and exchange stories related to LRG competences (8 associations)
- •peer-reviewing and monitoring of the SDGs progress (4 associations)



Persisting challenges

- **1. Support** from national governments
- 2. Need for increased **coordination** between levels of governance
- 3. Lack of human resources and capacities
- 4. Lack of awareness / interest at local level
- 5. Lack of access to information and data
