

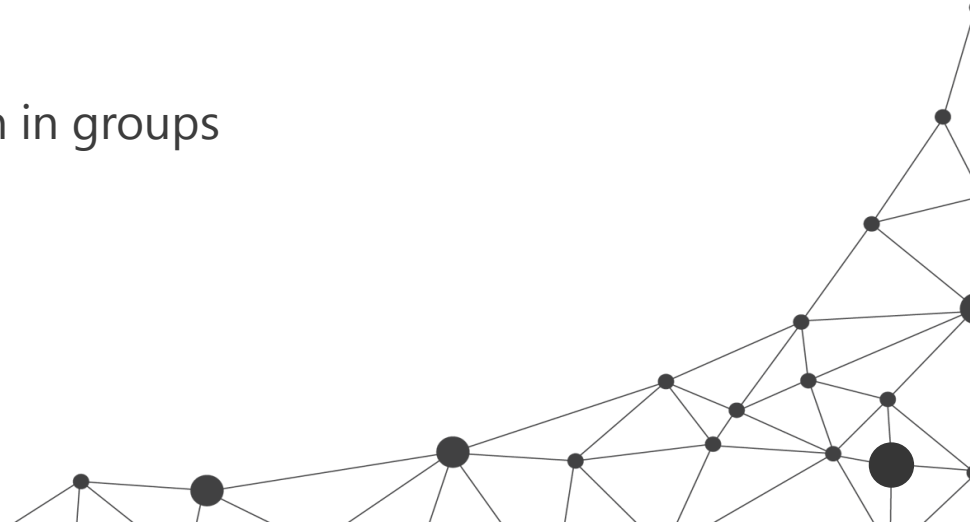

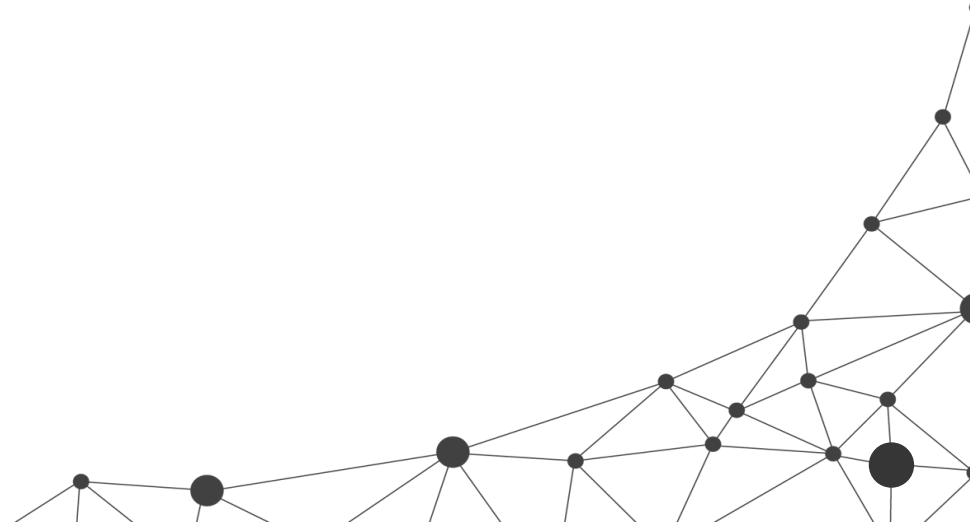

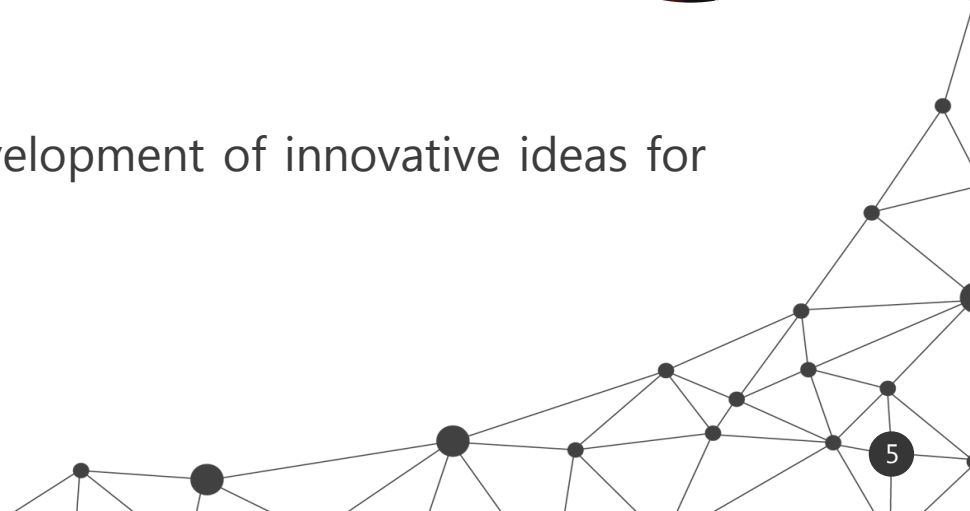


To facilitate worldwide **networking** between urban actors from politics, administration, business, science and civil society

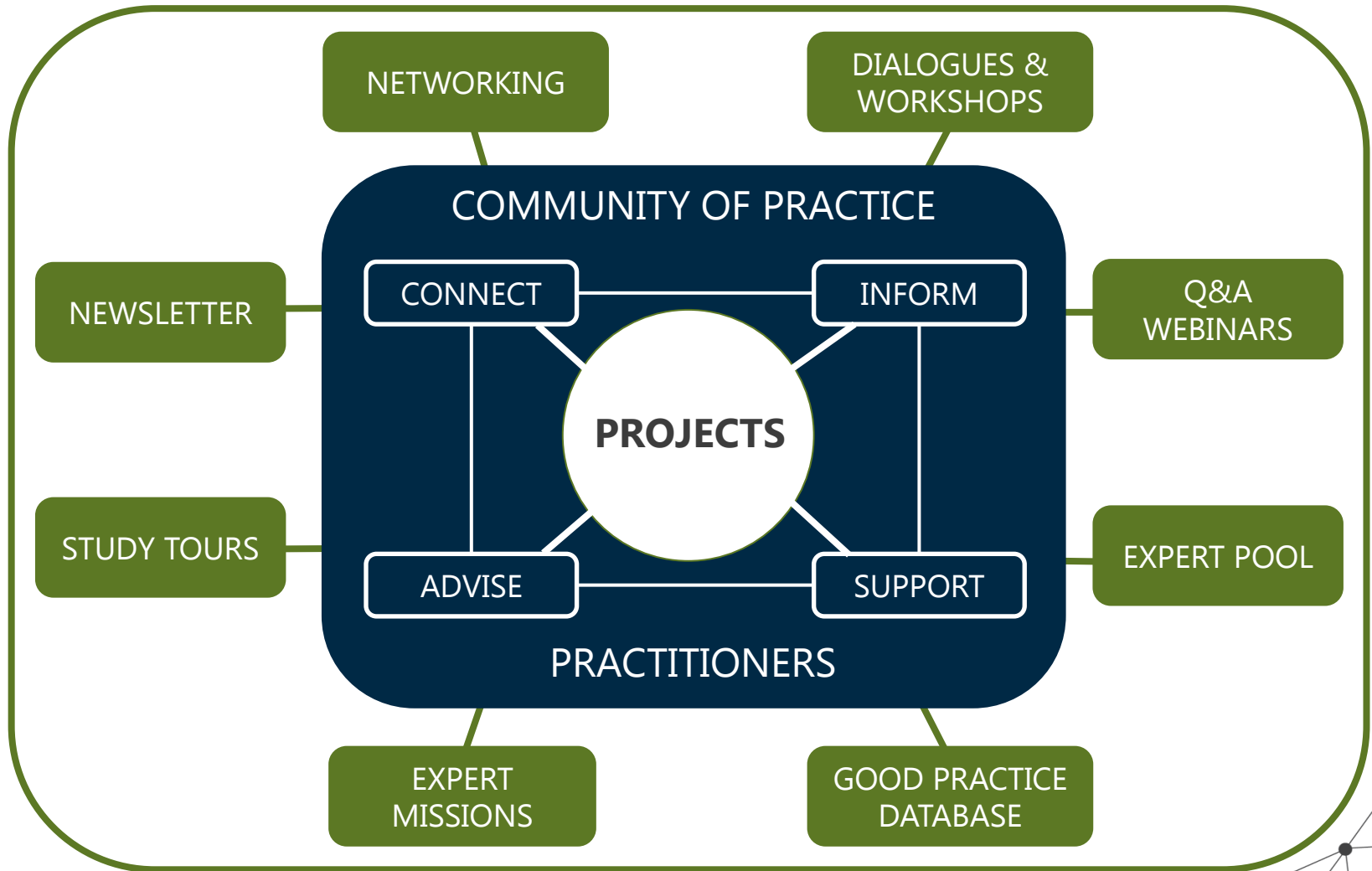

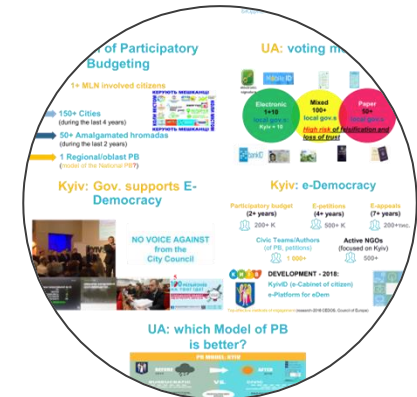

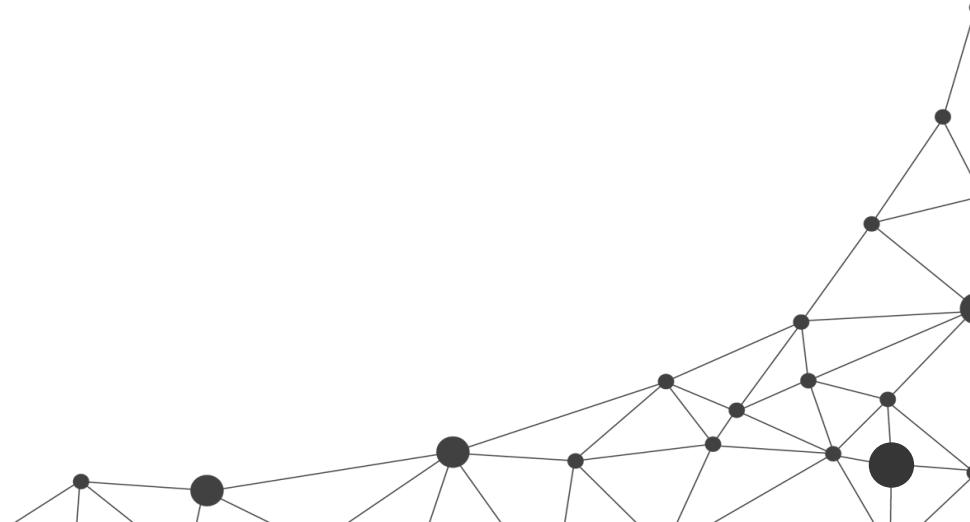

Peer-to-peer advice

Three steps:

1. Collection of cases / challenges
2. Priorization of cases
3. Peer-to-peer advice session



Peer-to-peer advice



1. Collection of cases / challenges

- A challenge you actually face and you have details about it
- Concrete challenge linked to the participatory budget within your municipality
- Challenge is within your range of influence
- Challenge can be dealt with in the short or medium term



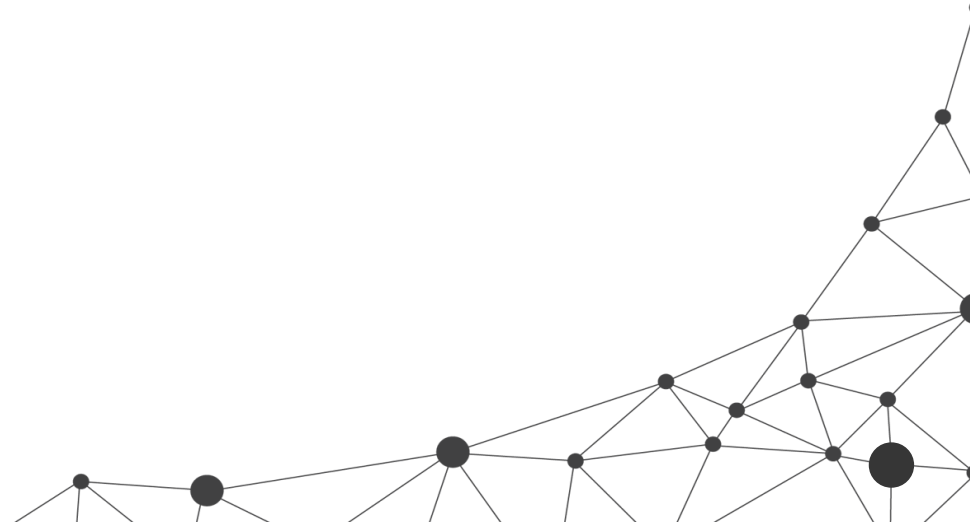
Peer-to-peer advice



2. Priorization of cases

- Depends on the know-how in this room
- Each group can only handle 1 case at a time
- One vote per participant

*For each group, please designate 1 **facilitator***



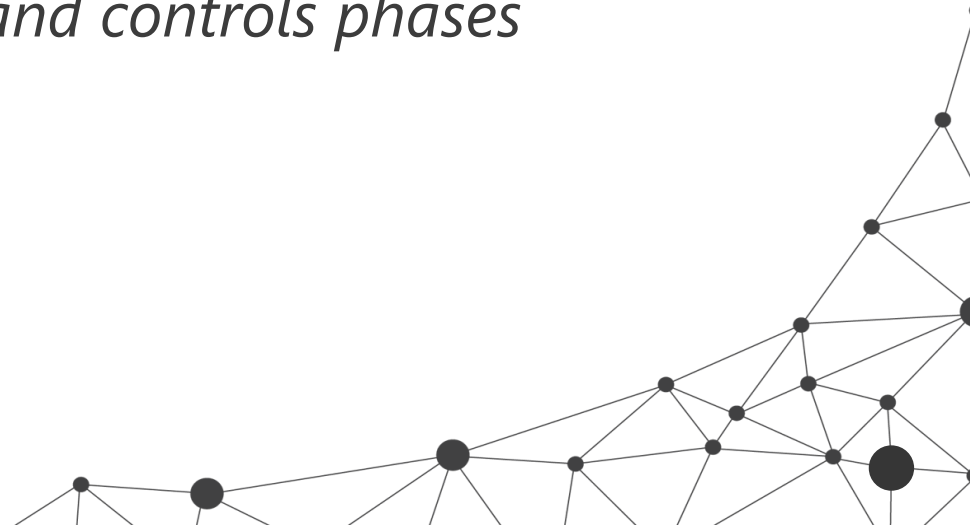
Peer-to-peer advice



3. Peer-to-peer advice session: 30 minutes

- 10 min: Case giver explains the case, advisors listen
- 5 min: Questions and answers of clarification
- 10 min: Advisors develop ideas / possible solutions
- 5 min: Feedback by case giver

Facilitator watches time and controls phases
