

socially integrative city – neighbourhood

management

- stabilising the neighbourhood
- providing better opportunities for education and participation
- improving the living environment
- with urban planning professionals



contact, project/area development, participation, structural improvements, activities



Key projekt –HELLE OASE

HELLE OASE – an urban wasteland becomes a community garden

- intermediate use of urban wasteland in public ownership
- approximately 4.000 m² surface, located next to a school, a youth center, housing and rail road tracks
- cooperation and participation as guiding principles
- established in 2012 as part of the project "Jugendliche wollen erfolgreich leben" - Youngsters want to live successful
- role of neighbourhood management: initiating and guiding the process






Helle Oase – starting points

Spatial:

- 5,3 % of urban wasteland in Hellersdorf-Nord*
- 5,4 ha urban wasteland in the neighborhood*
- Discontent of inhabitants with poor situation of their living environment



Social:

- unemployment rate: 11,75%* | 6,26%
- households depending on welfare: 36,34%* | 14,58%
- children in households depending on welfare: 60,8 %*
- unemployment rate in the age group 15-30 years: 26,3 %**

- deal productively with wasteland
- increase biodiversity in the city
- provide youngsters opportunities to try out different jobs
- establish an attractive and innovative place in the district
- create a place for environmental education
- integration and communication in neighborhood
- orovide opportunities for longterm civil engagement

Helle Oase – process

2012

- 03/12: initialising cooperations
- 04/12: get-together for interested persons
- 06/12: 1st open planning workshop for all
- 07/12: measuring the area
- 07/12: 2nd open planning workshop for all
- 09-10/12: binding cooperations with partners
- 10/12: start of construction

2013

- 03/13: flower beds
- 04/13: start of the 1st garden season
- 04/13: spring party / opening
- 04-06/13: building a play ground
- 10-11/13: planting an orchard ("foster trees")
- workshops on gardening / permaculture



2014

- 04/13: spring party
- opening of the boule court
- workshops on gardening/ permaculture
- volunteering days for companies
- BIWAQ-Funding ends




Helle Oase – today (outcomes)

- 379 young people participated in JUWEL
- Project gave 65% access to professional education or labour market
- 4.000 m² maintained garden with uses for all generations
- adds to a safe neighbourhood
- meeting point in the area
- place for environmental education
- anchor for local engagement: Group of 8-12 volunteers takes care of the garden
- won several prices, thus improves the image of the neighbourhood
- still developing: Starting point for new projects

Helle Oase – today (outcomes)

- Kids&Co still coordinates activities on site and raises funds for the garden
- due to short term financing there are less professional activities on site (like workshops)
- only lately an unlimited contract for the use of the site has been provided
- since 2010 population increase in the neighborhood, raises new challenges and demands on (public) urban space





Helle Oase – lessons learned

do's

- involve a supporting organisation, e.g. an NGO
- use expertise and facilities of the supporting organisations (e.g. for professional education)
- involve professionals in the set-up
- build up a network of partners (inhabitants, community centers, companies, local authorities, politicians)
- build partnerships to engage vulnerable groups
- engage citizens early and through diffent formats (festivals, workshop, foster trees, personal contact)
- flexibility: adopt a step-by-step approach
- find agreements with landowners
- promote your project

Helle Oase – lessons learned

pitfalls

- having no continuous funding for the garden projekt
- keep the group of volunteers open minded (communicative/ integrative character) and start new groups
- keep the garden evolving
- vandalism

Helle Oase – transfer

- find a guiding idea for the project and follow it
- combine professional education and improvement of the neighbourhood
- personal contact with young inhabitants
- involve citizens early and within different formats
- take demands and wishes of citizens serious
- build-up a group of volunteers very early
- build-up and maintain a network of partners
