- ☐ Inefficient collection of waste by County government due to non-payment by waste collectors in slum area
- ☐ Poor handling of waste
- ☐ Non-inclusion of CBOs
- ☐ Poor road networks
- ☐ Lack of business viability



INSTITUTIONAL SETTING

- ❑ Need for county to develop a tariff structure in order to;
 - Regulate management of transportation of waste
 - Encourage community to desist from illegal dumping

 - Nairobi City County- Department of Environment
 - JICA
 - Local CBOs involved in waste collection
 - Ministry of Health
 - Local NGOs
 - Private waste collectors

☐ Favourable tariffs

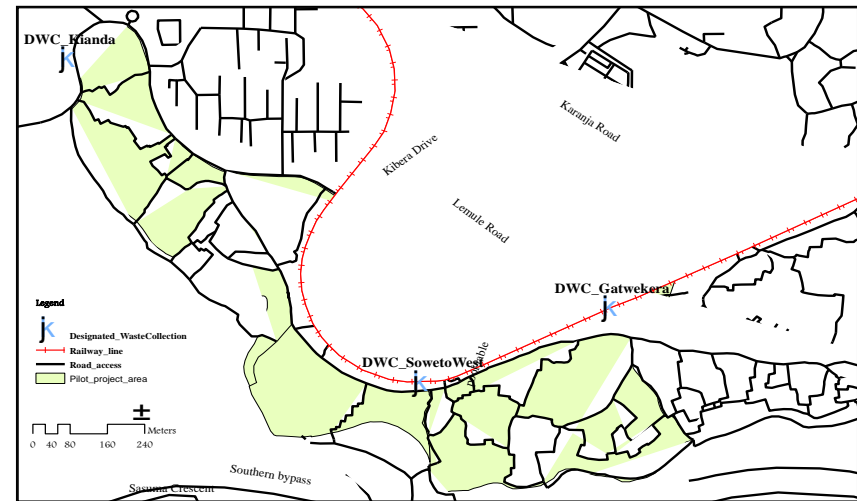
☐ Creation of Umbrella body to champion needs of CBOs involved in waste collection
