



GUIDE TO PREPARE GOOD PRACTICE PRESENTATIONS



- 1. <u>Starting point</u>: main challenge, issue, problem to be addressed by the practice (group of population affected)
- 2. <u>Institutional setting</u>: frame conditions for the practice (e.g. policy, instrument, demand by people according to roles, actors/stakeholders involved)
- 3. Approach: methods, tools or instruments applied
- 4. <u>Outputs</u>: concrete tangible results, outcomes and/or impacts (benefits and/or negative effects for different groups of population)
- 5. Lessons: main lessons learnt in the course of implementation
- 6. <u>Transfer</u>: necessary preconditions to transfer the practice to another place (first steps to take)

PEER-TO-PEER CONSULTATION - CHOOSING A TOPIC



- Introduction: what is meant by challenge in your area of responsibility – a topic you can move?
- Short discussion in small groups about challenges: "What challenge am I dealing with in my area of responsibility"
- Defining challenges and forming peer groups
- Peer-to-peer consultation

STEPS OF THE PEER-TO-PEER CONSULTATION



- 1) Presentation of the case by case giver
- 2) Questions of understanding by peers
- 3) First ideas among peers on what could be the problem (problem space)
- 4) Feedback by case giver
- 5) First ideas on what could be the solution (solution space)
- 6) Feedback by case giver
